Purpose and Mission

Help One Child is a non-denominational, hands-on Christian ministry whose mission is to recruit, train and support those willing to open their home or offer volunteer services to at-risk children in San Mateo and Santa Clara Counties. Services are offered to anyone caring for someone else's child whether through foster care, domestic or international adoption, or kinship care. Unique in the social service sector, Help One Child focuses on the whole family's needs, not just the child's.

What it is

Help One Child is the only Bay Area faith-based foster care recruitment resource. Ministry services include matching volunteers to families, distribution of donated goods and services, no-to-low cost education for families, resource libraries and parent support groups, social events, keeping in touch through telephone and e-mail, newsletters, and other publications. The ministry relies upon its dedicated volunteers and supporters to successfully offer this depth of service. Help One Child receives no government funding. It relies solely on individuals, corporate, or church donations and foundational grants to fund its various programs and services.

What you can do

- Join their prayer team.
- Volunteer as a babysitter, mentor, or tutor.
- Enlist your small group in a service project.

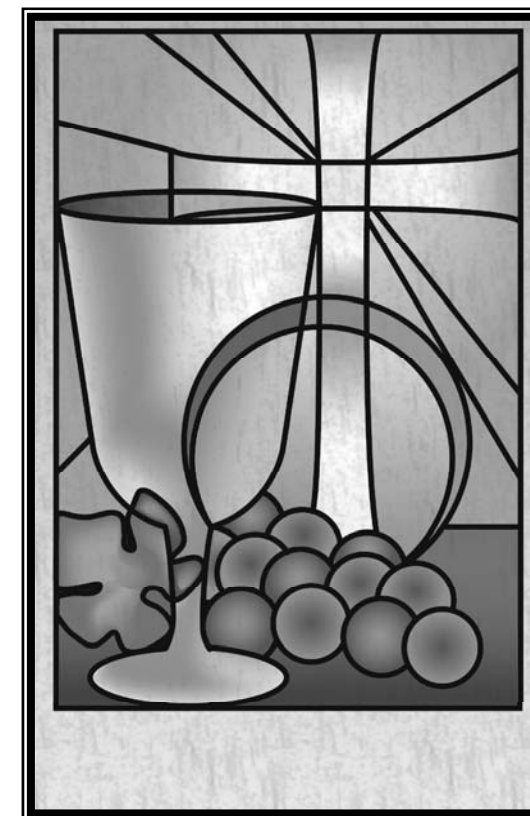

Communion: Sharing the Bread and Cup	
	The bread and juice of the sacrament are served today by a method called intinction. Worshipers are invited to come forward row by row, tear off a portion of bread, and dip it into the cup, thereby receiving the two elements together. If you prefer receiving the sacrament by the traditional method of bread with a small individual cup, proceed past the center stations to the side aisles where you will be served. If you are not able to come forward, let the servers know and they will come to where you are sitting.

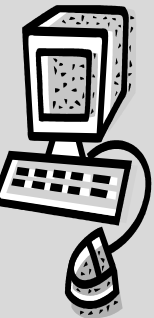

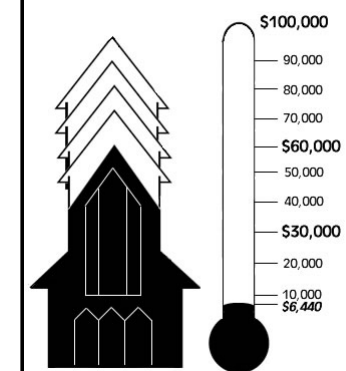
